## The University of Technology Sydney

UTS is a dynamic and innovative university in central Sydney. One of Australia's leading universities of technology, UTS has a distinct model of learning, strong research performance and a leading reputation for engagement with industry and the professions.

UTS is ranked in the top 250 universities by the Times Higher Education World University Rankings (opens an external site), which judges world class universities across all of their core missions—teaching, research, knowledge transfer and international outlook. UTS in 9th position is also the youngest of the 31 Australian universities included in the The World University Rankings top 800 rankings.

UTS ranked 1st in Australia and 21st globally in the Times Higher Education top 150 universities under 50 years of age global rankings, a comprehensive system designed for young universities with indicators linked to industry innovation as well as academic excellence.

UTS also placed 46th on the Times Higher Education list of the "Top 200 of the World's most international universities 2016". #### Fees & Conditions

4-weeks program fee is \$40,000 + GST for 5 people.

#### The fee includes the following:

- Room and AV hire
- Academic Facilitation/ Lectures
- Campus Tour

#### **Options for Accommodation:**

- Adina Apartment Hotel Sydney Central (2 bedroom apartment + 1 single) = \$466/ night x 28 days = AUD\$13,048.00
